Guidelines for Boarding your Pet

Welcome to Southpointe's updated boarding facility and exercise yard. We have a caring kennel staff and want to assure the best stay for your pet. We ask that you follow a few guidelines to help keep our kennel area clutter free.

1. Do not bring beds or blankets etc. with your pet. We have blankets and bedding that we provide for them here that is washed on a daily basis. With beds from home, they sometimes get misplaced or are too bulky for our washing machine to wash so they get set aside if they are soiled.
2. Toys or personal items: Please remember your pet's safety when choosing a toy to send with them. We will use our discretion of what is appropriate to leave with a pet. Anything that can be chewed up and possibly cause a choking hazard will NOT be left with a pet.
3. We feed our boarding dogs Purina EN canned and dry food.
We feed our boarding cats Science Diet Feline Maintenance dry and canned.
4. **If you would like your pet fed its own diet, please bring that food in a sealed container no larger than 10" deep X 14" high X 10" wide with its name clearly marked on the container. If you would like to send treats with your pet is used to eating, that would be fine. Leashes or cat carriers: If you bring your pet in to board with one of these, please take it back home with you as we do not have room to store these in the kennel area. Again we want to keep the boarding area clutter free.
5. You will be asked to fill out a boarding form that has specific instructions for your pet's care and an emergency phone number. If you have internet access, you can download a form at www.southpointevet.com and click on "Our Services" and then "Boarding". On this page you will see a button to click on to download the boarding form.
